COVID Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA)

To be eligible:

- You must have experienced financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic, AND
- Be three months behind on rent and/or utilities, AND
- Your household's income must be at or below the threshold

IMPORTANT: New applications will be accepted until May (subject to change). Existing applications will be processed until funds run out.

If eligible, you might get support to cover:

- Rent
- Utilities including internet bills



How to apply:

go to <https://ceraapp.michigan.gov> OR pick up a paper forms at 100 Arbana Drive, Ann Arbor, MI 48103

You will need to provide: your lease & proof of rent owed; Michigan ID; 2020 or 2021 tax return; proof of income

You may still be eligible if you cannot provide proof of income or ID.

Emergency Solutions Grant - COVID (ESG-CV)

To be eligible:

- Your household's income must be at or below the threshold
- You must have some threat of eviction



If eligible, you might get support to cover:

- Rent
- Application fees, security deposits, moving costs

IMPORTANT: This program is time-limited, funding may run out before September 2022.

How to apply: Call Housing Access for Washtenaw County (HAWC): 734-961-1999

You will need to provide: your lease; IDs for household members (adults: Social Security cards, children: birth certificates); proof of eviction threat & of income/benefits

State Emergency Relief

To be eligible:

- Be facing an emergency that threatens your health/safety (for example: eviction, utility shutoff)
- Your household's income and assets are below the threshold

If eligible, you might get support to cover:

- Moving costs
- Heat, electric & utility bills
- And more
